
MCF KUPTM NATIONAL HYBRID ONLINE INDIVIDUAL OPEN & CHALLENGER CHESS CHAMPIONSHIP 2021

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- In the early stages, the event was to be run as MCF National Hybrid Individual Open Chess Championship 2020. However, due to resurgence of COVID cases in Quarter 4 of 2020, the event was pushed to a later date in 2021.
- In January 2021, KUPTM came on board as co organizer for the event, offering its Campus in Taman Shamelin Perkasa as one of the Hybrid Center for the event.
- The initial 24 Hybrid Centers that were used in the earlier Hybrid events were again
 offered to take part in the event however, as it was school holidays, the independent
 Hybrid Centers set up by schools MRSM and SRAI, opted to skip the event. For the
 event, 17 Hybrid Centers were used with three (3) namely in Sibu, Kota Kinabalu and
 Kangar, did not manage to attract any players to play.
- As the day of the event draws closer, a few more centers had expressed their interest
 to be part of the Hybrid Network but in view that the existing centers are yet to be
 filled, the additional opening of Hybrid Centers were put on hold.
- With FIDE allowing the Hybrid event to be FIDE Rated, the event was submitted for Rating to FIDE in March 2021.
- In our effort to attract more players to participate in the event, and to offer better chances for players to win prizes, the event was separated into two(2) playing categories – Open (for players above ELO 1800) and Challenger (for those below ELO 1800).
- A total of 126 players took part in the event (34 players in the Open and 92 players in the Challenger), which was lower than the targeted 250 players for the event.
- Despite the lower number of players and the short span of time to promote the event, many players were satisfied with the way the event was being organized.
- Many Arbiters and Officials feel that the Hybrid playing concept is the best way to
 mitigate issues created by Online event (playing from home) as players may resort to
 getting help from other players or computers to play their game.

Highlights and Lowlights Lowlights Due to the tight dateline, responses for the event was lower As it was school break, the earlier schools that had joined us in the earlier Hybrid events were not able to participate As Interstate travelling was still restricted, there were challenges for players to choose their preferred Hybrid location As this is the first time a Classical event is being played online for Malaysia, it was a new experience for many Arbiters and Players • Due to strict regulatory requirement, it took almost 3 weeks for the event to be approved by the authorities



Challenges

- The COVID19 pandemic and the ensuing lockdown in many states remains as the main challenge in planning the exact date(s) for the event.
- As this is the first time a Classical Time Control with longer playing hours is used for Hybrid Online event, the team notices a few flaws and improvement that needs to be implemented and reported to Tornelo platform team.
- Unstable internet connection at certain Hybrid centers continue to provide challenges for players to get a stable connection
- · Many players are not familiar with the Tornelo playing platform

Points for Improvement

- · Provide a longer runaway in submitting application for COS/KBS approval
- Better costing method need to be employed to optimize the expenses
- · Aspire to digitalize the registration process to avoid and minimize errors
- · Engage more sponsors to help reduce Operations cost
- · Engage more media channels to promote event

Planned, Revised and Actual


- The original plan for the National Hybrid Online Individual Open Chess Championship 2020 was to run in a single
 category event using a Standard Time control of 60 minutes + 10 seconds. Having organized two (2) rapid Hybrid
 events earlier for the Ladies and Juniors, the use of a standard time control was to stretch the capability of the Hybrid
 Center in managing events with longer time controls in maintaining internet stability and connectivity, and to
 understand the challenges faced by the player when playing long games via computer screen.
- In response to FIDE's recommendation for Hybrid event to be rated, the time control was increased to 110 minutes + 10 seconds to allow for stronger players with 2200++ FIDE Rating to take part for it to be accepted for rating submission.
- With the new time control taking effect, the number of days for the event was increased to 5 days with 2 rounds per day except for the first day when there was only a single round played.
- With the change of the event format, the initial RM 10,850 budget was increased to more than RM 30,000 to make way for a higher prize money allocation, and rental of Hybrid Centers to run the event.

Financial Overview


The final costing reflected minimal impact to MCF accounts – having to cover RM 2,459.23 of the overall cost due to the lower number of participants playing in the event. Further, due to many Hybrid Centers not filling up to capacity, and a lower number of players signing up to play at the sponsored venue provided in kind by KUTPM, the cost to manage the Hybrid Centers (and its Arbiters) accounted for more than 50% of the total cost to manage the event to completion. MCF to review the costing to make sure that that costing for venues will be more manageable and at a lower percentage in order to optimize operations cost.




Despite the lower-than-expected turnout, the event is considered a success considering it to be the first Hybrid Online event that had used the longer Classical time control

While Hybrid Online tournament format may not significantly reduce organizers cost to manage event – in view of the number of Hybrid Centres and Local Arbiters that need to be employed, it contributes to the reduction of players' cost in terms of travelling, accommodation and time.

It will still take some time for the chess community to accept Hybrid Online tournament format as an acceptable new norm in organizing high level quality events.

With more world events organized by FIDE are conducted via Hybrid format, its popularity and acceptance will gradually grow as a viable alternative for chess organizing.




