Have you ever wondered how the pairings are done, how the players are paired and how the system allocate the colours?

Or how to upload the Swiss Manager file onto the website? And how do I link the tournaments together?

Do you know how to generate the winners of the Ladies category? Or the Junior category? And how to upload Rating List, or import players list? And how to split events with a single button? Or where to print the FA/IA reports and players norms?

All the above questions will be answered when you attend MCF Swiss Manager Beginner and Master Classes.

Content

- The Beginner Class will explain the rules, concept and methodology on how to perform the pairing manually without the aid of the program. By understanding how the pairing is done, only then you will be able to answer questions like:
 - Why am I playing 2 black pieces in a row?
 - Why am I playing A and not B?
 - Why am I playing the higher/lower pointer player?
- Participants will also learn how to set up different events using Swiss Manager program, key in event and players details, set up tournament systems, including editing and amending information as and when necessary. Participant will also be able to understand the common tie breaks used for tournaments, the definition of each tie breaks used, and how to amend the tie breaks to suit your tournament.
- Additional topics will also includes downloading and uploading FIDE and National Rating list, printing results and event details, and changing the details required in the printing including submission for FIDE Rating and National Rating purposes.

Content

- The Master Class will go beyond individual tournament, including explaining and detailing the lesser used features of Swiss Manager. This includes steps to manage and start a Team event, uploading team and player's data, and arranging board orders.
- The Master Class also will teach participants how to manage the information that is published in www.chess-results.com website, and how to group tournaments together with a link.
- Participants will also know how to do force pairing, prohibit pairing or to fix board (for OKU players). Participants will also learn how to upload players list (not necessary FIDE Rating List or National Rating List), separate the winners and generate best board prizes for team events
- Finally, participants will also learn how to produce reports especially for Arbiters who want to apply for FA/IA title, and for players who want to earn their norms.

Learning Objectives

- Manage force pair, prohibition pairing and players exclusion
- Upload players bulk listing including splitting tournaments
- Generate/Print winners list by gender, age groups and other groups
- Start and manage a Team tournament, upload team listing, board order, and match cards

- Produced reports by Swiss Manager for IA/FA and players' norms
